### First Lego League Wollongong regional competition



On Saturday 10 November, the Stage 3 enrichment class, also know as the Wonders of Wollongong West, competed in the First Lego League Wollongong regional robotics competition at The Illawarra Grammar School (TIGS). As part of the competition, students build, program and compete with a robot, while also learning about a modern problem in science and engineering and developing solutions for it. The Wonders of Wollongong West have successfully placed in the top 6 and progressed to the state championships, which are to be held on Saturday 24 November at St Mary's Star of the Sea College in Wollongong. This is a wonderful achievement for a team which is largely made up of rookie members. On top of this, the team also won the award for Gracious Professionalism! Our team was recognised for demonstrating high-quality work, emphasising the value of others, and respecting individuals and the community.

### Stage 3 Canberra Camp

Students from stage 3 have recently undertaken an educational tour of the national capital, Canberra. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.



Students had a busy schedule over the 3 days. They visited old and new Parliament House, Questacon, the National Museum, the National Capital Exhibition, the War Memorial, the Australian Institute of Sport, Telstra Tower, the Australian Electoral Commission and had a boat cruise on Lake Burley Griffin.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. The Australian Government contributed funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program. This assisted families by reducing the final cost of the excursion. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and then passed on to the tour operators. We are grateful to the Australian Government for their support as the children had a wonderful time and learnt a lot along the way.




