Welcome Letter – Term 1, 2019

Dear Families of Wollongong West,

It is with great anticipation and excitement that we commence the 2019 school year. 2019 promises to be a fun, enriching and exciting year.

This year, we continue our work towards achieving our strategic directions in our school plan for 2018-2020. Our school vision is:

At Wollongong West Public School, we will learn, teach and lead for excellence. We will empower students to be successful learners, confident and creative individuals and active and informed citizens of today and for tomorrow.

We will be working towards the following three strategic directions as identified in our School Plan 2018-2020.

- * Excellence in Literacy and Numeracy
- * Learning for Today and Tomorrow
- * Quality Teachers and Leaders

This year, our children will continue to thrive academically, socially, emotionally, spiritually and physically with many wonderful initiatives being undertaken.

- Our Instructional Leadership program, led by Mrs Heritage, will continue in 2019. All children will have their progress regularly tracked in the areas of literacy and numeracy and all children will be actively working towards personalised learning goals. Teachers will meet regularly to plan differentiated learning pathways in literacy and numeracy for every child at our school.
- Our teachers will continue to fine tune our implementation of formative assessment strategies to strengthen the literacy and numeracy programs across our school. Daily assessment of student learning will ensure tomorrow's lessons target each child's individual need.
- Mathematics will be a priority for teacher professional learning in 2019, as we work towards further strengthening our teacher practice in this area.
- Integrated units of work will be implemented across stage groups that ensure quality inquiry based learning in the key learning areas of History, Geography, Science and Technology, Personal Development and Health. Termly units of work will culminate in a rich task where

students will showcase their learning and consider future implications of their learning in the real world.

- Mrs Kandilas-Feld will be in the role of Teacher Mentor in 2019, supporting teachers across our school in the expert integration of digital technologies into daily classroom practice.
- In 2019, flexible learning spaces will be introduced into our library and some classrooms. These modern learning environments will support our children in developing their skills in collaboration, creativity, critical thinking and communication as we launch our inquiry-based units of work.
- All children in Years K-6 will participate in weekly specialist mathematics lessons with Miss Bormann. These lessons will have a strong focus on the areas of Measurement, Geometry Statistics and Probability. All students in Years 4-6 will further participate in a spatial reasoning program in Terms 2-4. This exciting initiative will be in partnership with professors from the University of Canberra.
- Weekly creative arts classes will be provided for every child under the expertise of Mrs Morrissey. Each term will see a different focus in the areas of Visual Arts, Drama, Dance and Music. These specialist classes will allow children to grow, shine and thrive in these different areas. In addition, children will have opportunities to perform in extra-curricular groups, such as dance troupes and choirs.
- Student wellbeing will continue to be a priority as all classes school wide will be engaging in explicit lessons to support positive social skills and relationships, emotional regulation and behaviour expectations. Mrs Pezzutto will be leading this important teaching K-6 in 2019.
- In 2019, we will also be launching the *Got It!* Program at our school. This program is fully funded through NSW Health. Families, children and teachers in K-2 will be able to access support from clinical psychologists, occupational therapists and paediatricians to ensure sustainable early intervention for students in the early years of school.
- This year also sees the establishment of a Refugee Student Support Leader position at our school. Mr Cameron Ling was successful in applying for this position. While Mr Ling will be supporting refugee programs across all schools in the Wollongong network, we are thrilled to have this valuable resource at our school. He will strengthen and bring valuable expertise to the exciting programs we have in place to support our students and families from a refugee background.
- Our school will continue to provide weekly swimming lessons for every child during Terms 1 and 4. Lessons will commence next week. Please ensure that you have returned your child's permission note to participate in these classes. Mrs Hickey will continue to lead the sporting programs at our school, applying for grants to ensure our children are accessing expert instruction in a wide variety of sports.
- Our Community Hub will continue operating this year. The hub will provide additional support for all families, particularly those families from a refugee background. Increased community events will promote engagement and connectedness between all families in our

school community. More information regarding our hub will be distributed to families soon.

What an exciting year it will be!

In staffing news, Mrs Jan Renwick, our hard working library assistant, retired at the end of 2018. We wish her much happiness in her retirement.

Mrs Holly Degotardi, who has worked at our school in a temporary capacity for eight years has been successful in her application for permanent appointment within the catholic education system. We wish her much success in her new position.

I also thank Mr Wayne Norington for his service to our school in 2018 as a School Learning Support Officer. We farewell Mr Norington as he pursues other career opportunities.
